We always know how to raise hands instead of calling out. We are learning lots of pre-reading skills and some of our students will actually be reading at the end of the school year. 
The year is flying by and your children are growing in leaps and bounds. They are making great academic and social strides. This class is a very caring and kind group; they make us smile everyday!
